About the Role

Before launching a bike mentoring program the Guelph Wellington Local Immigration Partnership would like to learn from similar programs offered in other cities e.g., <u>Toronto</u>, <u>Markham</u>, <u>Vancouver</u>. For this research project you will 1) work with the LIP to identify the questions they would like to answer about these bike programs, 2) review relevant academic and non-academic literature about the programs, and 3) produce useable and useful summaries of the findings from the literature review.

There are two deliverables for this project:

- A short, written report. Approximately 5-10 pages, to include a summary of the research project, the results, a description of methods used, and a list of the sources reviewed.
- A summary of just the results e.g., a one-page document, presentation slide(s) or infographic. (Format to be determined in consultation with the LIP)

This position reports to the facilitator of the Guelph Lab.
